Belong Wisconsin also provides family connection events, day-long events held throughout the state that help separated families and communities stay connected year-round.

Royal Family Kids Camp

Since 1985, Royal Family Kids (RFK) Camp has been offering week-long summer camps for children of abuse who have been placed in foster care. For many of these children, a week at summer camp is a first. It is a life-changing experience for them!

In 2008, Royal Family KIDS Mentoring Clubs were started to provide an opportunity for the church to connect with their campers during the school year and continue the hope that was experienced at camp. Camps & mentoring clubs are sponsored by individual, well-established Christian churches of various denominations.

There are currently six camps and three mentoring clubs in Wisconsin serving these children, with wonderful volunteers who have dedicated thousands of hours to reach America's orphaned and abandoned children.

The Fostering Success program at UW Stout provides services specifically designed to aid former foster youth in transitioning to and through college. Students eligible for Fostering Success have experienced one of the following:

- Orphan/ward of the court
- Homelessness
- Guardianship
- Other out-of-home care not specified above
