The webinar identifies common barriers you may face as you work to create a strong relationship and offers tools and strategies for overcoming them.

Parents involved in the child welfare system often need support to help them through their journey and foster parents may be well-positioned to provide the support needed. This webinar helps foster parents understand how to be a support to birth parents and provides tips for doing so successfully.

This mini-training focuses on practical steps foster parents can take to build collaborative relationships with birth parents to provide the best possible outcomes for children in care.

### Co-parenting Through Connection
